2017 SCHOOLS' BEACH WATER POLO COMPETITION

Sanction No.: 31721

Competition Date: Saturday October 21, 2017. Games begin at 2:00 p.m.
Warm-up begins at 1:00 p.m.

Venue: The National Stadium Pool.

Competition Entry Fee: \$3,000 per team. This includes the pool-use fee for players as well as the cost of awards for teams which finish in the top 3.

Entry Requirements:

1. All players **MUST** be registered students of the school/institution which they will be representing
2. Schools may enter teams in a male &/or female category
3. There will be three age groups: 13 & under, 16 & under and 19 & under. Age as at Dec 31, 2017.
4. Each school may enter one team in each age-group category
5. A maximum of twelve (12) players can be entered for each team
6. A minimum of five (5) players must be registered for each team
7. The entry fee for each team must be submitted with the entry forms
8. Entry Forms for the competition must be submitted to the office of the Amateur Swimming Association of Jamaica by 6.00 p.m. Friday, October 06, 2017
9. The Entry Form must be signed by a Senior School Official
10. The competition schedule will be provided on the day of the event

Competition Rules:

1. Games will be played in a 20m by 15m pool area
2. There will be 4 field players plus one goalie playing at a time
3. The first team to score 6 goals (male games) and 4 goals (female games) wins the game
4. Teams switch sides when one team has scored 3 goals (male games) and 2 goals (female games)
5. Goalies cannot shoot at opponent's goal
6. An 'immediate' shot may be taken from corner throw
7. Excluded players may return immediately after touching wall or line behind goal line and outside goal posts
8. Unless otherwise specified, the competition will be governed by the latest edition of the FINA Water Polo Guide

ADDENDUM TO SUMMONS

1. Teams must be ready for the official presentation ten (10) minutes before the scheduled start of each game. For presentation, players will wear their school shirt. Any player who is absent from the presentation will NOT be allowed to play in that game.
2. If a team does not have the minimum five (5) persons at the time of the official presentation, that team will be considered to have forfeited that game. The victory will be awarded to the team which is present and has, at least, the minimum number of players.
3. The nails of all players will be checked by the referee either before or immediately following the presentation. ALL NAILS MUST BE CUT AND FILED. The official desk will not provide nail clips. If, in the referee's opinion, a player's nails are not satisfactory, that player will NOT be allowed to play in that game.
4. Each team must have a manager with whom the organizing committee and official desk can liaise. The team manager should be present for all of the team's games.
5. Females will not be allowed to play in the male category unless permission is granted by the Meet Director.
6. Teams are reminded that disrespect, violence and unsportsmanlike conduct of any form will not be tolerated. If the referee believes there to be evidence of any of these infractions, the relevant sanction will be enforced. Failure to comply will result in the disqualification of the entire team.
7. The head coach is allowed to stand, pass instructions to the players in the pool and move to the 5 meter line when his team is on offense. The head coach must not address the referee, any official, player or spectator in an aggressive manner. The assistant coach MUST remain seated and may not address the referee. Misconduct by the head coach may result in a yellow card or 'warning' or a red card. Any team member or official who is issued a red card must leave the pool area and will receive a one-game ban. Failure to comply with the instructions of the referee will result in the disqualification of the entire team and further sanctions, if necessary.
