## BLP16.1.1 CARIFTA

1. Final Selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council.
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaica Citizen or resident in Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the meet.
3. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ a minimum of three weeks prior to the start of the final local qualifying meet.
4. Times swum on or after July 1 of the year prior to the competition will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
5. Times must have been swum in a long course meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other FINA recognized body.
6. Swimmer must qualify in at least two (2) events.
7. Swimmer must be ranked in 1st or 2 nd place in the event in which the standard is achieved.
8. Qualifying times:
a. Latest TUSS AA time standards.
b. The 8th place median of the last three years in events where there are no TUSS standards.
c. Tables with the time standards will be published by September 1 each year.
9. In the event that only three individuals have qualified in an age group, a fourth swimmer will be selected to be a part of a relay team whose combined times as determined by Hy-Tek, would match or better the 3rd place median for the event for the last three years.

## BLP16.1.2 CCCAN

1. Final Selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council.
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaican Citizen or resident in Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the meet.
3. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ a minimum of three weeks prior to the start of the final local qualifying meet.
4. Times swum January 1 or after in the year of competition will be considered for 11-14 swimmers.
5. Times swum up to twelve months prior to the start of the competition will be considered for 15 \& over swimmers. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
6. Times must have been swum in a long course meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other FINA recognized body.
7. Swimmer must qualify in at least two (2) events.
8. Swimmer must be ranked in 1st or 2 nd place in the event in which the standard is achieved.
9. Qualifying times:
a. Latest TUSS AAA times standards
b. The 8th place median of the last three years in events where there are no TUSS standards.
c. Tables with the time standards will be published by September 1 each year.
10. In the event that only three individuals have qualified in a category, a fourth swimmer will be selected to be a part of a relay team whose combined times as determined by Hy-Tek, would match or better the 3rd place median for the event for the last three years.

## BLP16.1.3 UANA CUP

1. Final Selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council.
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaica Citizen or resident in Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the meet.
3. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ a minimum of three weeks prior to the start of the final local qualifying meet.
4. Times swum between June 1 and November 30 of the year prior to the competition will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
5. Times must have been swum in a long course meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other FINA recognized body.
6. Swimmer must qualify in at least one (1) event.
7. Swimmer must be ranked in 1 st or 2 nd place in the event in which the standard is achieved.
8. Qualifying times:
a. Latest TUSS AAAA times standards
b. The 8th place median of the last three years in events where there are no TUSS standards. In 2019 it will be simply the 8th place for 2018 and in 2020 it will be the mean of the 8th place times for 2018 and 2019
c. Tables with the time standards will be published by September 1 each year.

## BLP16.1.8 GOODWILL

1. Final Selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council no later than June of the GOODWILL year.
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaica Citizen or resident in Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the meet.
3. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ a minimum of three weeks prior to the start of the final local qualifying meet.
4. Times swum from December 1st of the year prior to the competition up to May 31st of the competition year will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
5. Times must have been swum in a SCM or LCM meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other FINA recognized body. SCM qualifying times will get preference over LCM times.
6. The swimmer must qualify in at least two (2) events.
7. The swimmer must be ranked 1st or 2 nd place in the event in which the qualifying time is achieved.
8. Qualifying times:
a. The 8th place median time set in an individual event at the last three Goodwill meets.
b. Tables with the qualifying times will be published by October 1st each year.
9. In the event that only two or three individuals have qualified in a relevant category, a third and/or fourth swimmer will be selected to be a part of a relay team whose combined times as determined by Hy-Tek, would match or better the 3rd place median time for the event for the last three years. The swimmer(s) selected using the relay clause must have at least one (1) qualifying time in an individual event.
10. Should there be more than the maximum 4 swimmers qualifying in a particular age group, then the swimmers will be ranked first by number of qualifying events and secondly by highest FINA points for the events in which they have qualified.

## BLP16.1.9 WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

1. Final selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaican citizen with a valid Jamaican passport
3. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ no less than 12 months prior to the competition
4. Times swum between January 1st, 2018 and April 30th, 2019 will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
5. Times must have been swum at a long course meet.
6. Qualifying times:
a. As published by the organizing committee OR
b. Where no swimmer has met qualifying times, swimmers will be ranked by FINA points and the top swimmers will be selected. A maximum of four (4) male and four (4) female swimmers without automatic qualifying times can be selected.

## BLP 16.1.10 FINA WORLD JUNIORS SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Swimmer must be a citizen of Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the 2019 World Juniors Swimming Championships and holder of a valid Jamaican passport
2. Swimmer must be registered with the ASAJ no less than three weeks before a qualifying meet.
3. Swimmer must be between 14 and 17 (girls) and 15 and 18 (boys) years old on December 31st of the competition year.
4. Times swum between March 1st, 2018 and June 30 th, 2019 will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
5. Times must have been swum at an LCM meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other FINA-recognised bodies.
6. Swimmer must have achieved at least 600 FINA points in Olympic swimming events 100 M and over.
7. The maximum number of athletes will be limited to four (4) girls and four (4) boys. Should the number of qualifying candidates exceed that maximum, then the athletes will be ranked by highest FINA points for each swimmer's single best qualifying time satisfying the condition of two (2) swimmers per event, and the top female and top male performers selected.

## PANAM GAMES UNIVERSALITY SELECTION

1. Swimmer must be a citizen of Jamaica no less than 12 months prior to the entry deadline of the 2019 Pan American Games and must be the holder of a valid Jamaica passport.
2. Swimmer must register/have registered with the ASAJ no less than three weeks before a qualifying meet.
3. Times swum between March 1st, 2018 and April 30th, 2019 will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included.
4. Times must have been swum at a FINA-sanctioned PanAm/World Championships qualifying meet.
5. The swimmer must have achieved a minimum of 700 FINA points in an Olympic swimming event.
6. The maximum number of universality athletes at the PanAm Games is 2 per country: one (1) male and one (1) female. Should the number of qualifying candidates exceed that maximum, then the athletes will be ranked by highest FINA points for each swimmer's single best qualifying time, and the top female and top male performer selected.
